LOCAL KNOWLEDGE: How to Enter the Basin at Chesapeake City without running aground

Boaters should enter Chesapeake City's basin with caution. There is a sizeable shoal in the center of what appears to be a trouble-free approach to the town's waterfront. The constant passage of deep-draft commercial shipping creates the shoal that hangs up many a boater who attempts to enter without local knowledge. **The deepest water depths are close to the bulkhead of the Army Corps of Engineers' property at the east side of the entrance to the basin.** **RED** and **GREEN** markers were placed in the basin entrance indicating safe passage into the basin.

Deepest water is close to the bulkhead holding the **GREEN MARKER**.

TOWN DOCKS

Located on the west side of the basin. Dockmaster: 443-350-2442. **2 Transient Slips; Room for 3 to 4 boats** to tie up on the long dock. Free dockage space. Fee for water and electric. First come-first serve. 24 hour limit.

Deep water transient slips along canal-front bulkhead. Tie up overnight or for a restaurant visit. **Gas, Diesel** pumped from 9 to 9 daily; Fri./Sat. 9 to 10.
